**1 – A ADORATION OF THE HOLY  
EUCARIST — BEING IN  
LOVE WITH JESUS CHRIST**  
**(3 hour class continues in the afternoon)**

To deepen your love for someone demands that you continuously spend time, treasure the presence and discover newness in the relationship with that person. It is this light that the seminar is designed to provide a deeper understanding of the Holy Eucharist.

**Morning Session (Part 1):**

Will focus on the new meaning that Jesus gave to the Jewish celebration of Passover (which we generally refer to as the “Last Supper” or the “Lord’s Supper”). Passover is a defining moment for Israel, as a nation, for it is a historical experience of redemption.

**Afternoon Session (Part 2):**

Will discuss how we, as the body of Christ, are challenged to participate actively in the celebration of the Eucharist and witness to Jesus in our family, community, workplace and the Church. Discussions aim to highlight the need for a constant Eucharistic adoration, both personally and as a community, in order to fulfill our Christian mission, the “sending forth” after the Mass.

**2 – A/B SCRIPTURE AND THE MASS**

Sacred Scripture has a revered and important place in the Eucharistic Liturgy and flows throughout the prayers of the Mass. Through taking a closer look into the scriptural background of the Mass, we come to know more closely Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, whose Paschal Mystery we celebrate!

**3 – A/B HOW DOES THAT APPLE TASTE?**  
**(Also known as “Original Sin”)**

Remember the first time you heard the term “original sin?” What did it mean to personally? Today we often speak of the human condition rather than original sin. In this session we will reflect on our own little Garden of Eden and our own “apple.” The session will focus on our human condition today; the influences in our lives and the amazing camouflaged gifts we so often miss seeing in ourselves and in others. What may appear at first glance as evil may, in fact, be our greatest gift of our Creator—the place of our salvation. This will be a time to take another look at who we really are. If you keep a journal, please bring it with you.

AND HOUSING**

**5 – A ENGAGING YOUTH IN LITURGY**
